## Guiyang releases sparkling results for H1 2022



Since the beginning of 2022, Guiyang, the capital of Southwest China's Guizhou province, has been moving full-steam ahead towards its goal of being a "strong provincial capital." In the first six months of 2022, Guiyang registered impressive performance. It posted RMB224.099 billion in GDP, beating the target by RMB14.099 billion, and its growth rate reached 4.6%, ranking fourth in the province, 0.1% higher than the provincial average and 2.1% than the national average. The city saw RMB143.7 billion in fixed asset investment, meeting the half-year target and representing a growth rate of 11%.

### ◎ Promoting industrial development

In the first half of 2022, the city posted RMB207.4 billion in total industrial output value, exceeding the half-year target by RMB32.4 billion. Manufacturing accounted for 21.6% of the city's GDP, 2.6 percentage points higher than the annual target. The area of newly built standard plants amounted to 1.668 million square meters, surpassing the half-year target by 773,000 square meters, and the area of standard plants newly started reached 8,165,200 square meters, exceeding the half-year target of 1,875,200 square meters. A total of 12,925.7 mu of land was collected for industrial uses, 5,583.7 mu higher than the half-year target. The total output value

of state-owned manufacturing enterprises reached RMB48.6 billion, exceeding the half-year target by RMB6.6 billion. The seven key industrial segments posted RMB99.46 billion in total output value, exceeding the half-year target by RMB19.46 billion. Paid-in investment of newly introduced projects was RMB82.927 billion, RMB2.927 billion higher than the half-year target, of which newly introduced industrial projects accounted for 56.23%, 1.23 percentage points higher than the target. The software and information technology service industry brought in revenue of RMB31.848 billion, beating the half-year target by RMB8.035 billion.

### ◎ Ramping up urban construction

The Phase I civil engineering project of Guiyang Metro Line 3 completed 93.09% of the tasks for the year, and 112.15 square kilometers of sponge city

infrastructure was completed, accounting for 29.28% of the built-up areas, exceeding the half-year target by 0.95 percentage points.

### ◎ Advancing the development of agriculture and rural areas

In the first half of 2022, the city's total output value of agriculture, forestry, animal husbandry and fisheries reached RMB13.591 billion, an increase of 6.5% year on year (YoY). The output value

of the farming industry was RMB9.270 billion, which made up 68.2% of that of agriculture, up 6.2% YoY. 59% of agricultural produces were processed, meeting the half-year target.

### ◎ Boosting the development of the tourism industry

Guiyang pressed ahead with the construction of blocks blending commercial, tourism and cultural elements and put into operation a number of featured blocks such as the Xingyuemao high street

close to a metro station in Yunyan District and the Shizijie high street in Huaxi District. The city also carried out a series of promotional events to get the tourism industry back on track.

### ◎ Creating an enabling business environment

New progress was made in the construction of the China (Guiyang) Intellectual Property Protection Center,

and the full-process electronic bidding (procurement) system was officially launched ahead of schedule.

### ◎ Protecting the environment

Guiyang laid out a city-wide plan for waste classification and introduced classification

measures. The rate of days with good air quality was 100% in the first half of the year.

### ◎ Improving people's livelihoods

Per capita disposable income in urban and rural areas grew by 6% and 6.6%, respectively, higher than the half-year GDP

growth, meeting the half-year target. The permanent resident population added 129,900, exceeding the half-year target by 27,900.

### ◎ Increasing employment and talent support

A total of 86,227 new jobs were created, 11,227 higher than the target set for the first six months of the year. The "123" talent program was

launched, which provided RMB113 million in funding for five projects, with another 13 projects being evaluated.

# Guiyang International Land Port officially opens

In Guizhou, an inland province away from the ocean and the Yangtze River, higher logistics costs and longer lead time pose great challenges to many foreign trade companies and also create bottlenecks for the growth of foreign trade. The Guiyang International Land Port has recently opened, making it much easier and less costly for companies in Guizhou to carry out foreign trade.

At the beginning of 2022, the No. 2 document issued by the State Council highlighted the strategic positioning of Guizhou to build an inland economy with a new height of openness, and pledged to support Guangzhou Port, Shenzhen Port and Beibu Gulf Port to set up a land port in Guizhou. With the support of government departments at the provincial and municipal levels, Guiyang Free Trade Zone commenced the construction of the Guiyang International Land Port in April.

On June 2, at the symposium on the construction of the land port jointly held by Guangdong and Guizhou in Guangzhou, Guizhou Railway Investment Group Co., Ltd. signed a strategic cooperation agreement with Guangzhou Port Group Co., Ltd. and Hutchison Ports YANTIAN, respectively. A raft of measures was introduced, laying solid groundwork for the construction of the land port.

On June 28, the Guizhou-Guangdong train loaded with 36 coaches of goods produced in Guizhou left the Dulaying International Land-sea Logistics Port for Port of Nansha in Guangzhou and Yantian Port in Shenzhen. The successful launch of the test train signifies that the Guiyang International Land Port can serve the basic functions such as Less-than Container Load (LCL) service, issuance of bills of lading, a comprehensive foreign trade service platform, foreign exchange settlement and tax refund. In other words, the port is basically ready for official opening.

On August 27, a freight train carrying 35 containers of Guizhou-made tires departed from the land port for Port of Nansha. At the same time, a freight train carrying home appliances and kitchenware left Port of Nansha for the land port, from which the cargo will be transported to Volsino of Russia via the China-Europe Railway Express.

This is the first Guiyang-Guangdong train that departed from the Guiyang International Land Port and marks the start of the two-way freight train service between the two ports. Moreover, it also signifies the official opening of the Guiyang International Land Port and the Guiyang-Guangdong rail freight corridor.

The customs, quarantine, sanitation inspection and other agencies in the land port provide customs clearance and related services for companies operating in Guizhou. This not only reduces the costs for road, rail and sea transshipment operations and the storage, loading and unloading costs between the inland port and other ports, but also greatly improves the customs clearance efficiency. Therefore, companies can carry out import/export operations in a more cost-effective, efficient and convenient manner.

The land port provides LCL service for companies that import or export small batches of products. "In the past, when a small quantity of cargo was not enough to fill up the entire container, or the container returned empty, it would be uneconomical for companies, so they might choose other logistics methods. In response, the International Land Port offers LCL service, which also helps ensure the continuous operations of cross-border freight trains," said a chief at Guiyang Free Trade Zone. Goods in general trade, goods for ecommerce and goods in transit or bond transported via various routes such as the China-Europe Railway Express, the China-Laos Railway and the Guizhou-Guangdong Railway can be containerized in the same area, which will further promote the regular operations of China-Europe freight trains.

With the improvement of its functions and facilities, the land port can provide more cost-effective and efficient customs clearance services for foreign trade companies operating in the province. This is expected to attract more companies to the province to engage in foreign trade. In the future, the land port will give full play to its functions to help ensure the regular operations of China-Europe freight trains, and develop a hub economy to ultimately create the effects of industrial agglomeration and accelerate the development of new business formats. In doing so, it will promote high-standard opening-up of the province and the city, integrate into the new development paradigm in which domestic and foreign markets boost each other, and serve the province's endeavor to build an inland economy with a new height of openness.

# 2022 China-ASEAN Education Cooperation Week held in Guizhou

The Week produced fruitful results. First, the China-ASEAN Education Senior Officials Meeting mechanism on education was established. The Third China-ASEAN Education Ministers Roundtable Conference adopted the *Building a Friendly Homeland: Vision and Actions for China-ASEAN Educational Cooperation and Development (2020-2030)*, identifying focus areas for bilateral educational cooperation in the next stage. Second, the seminars, forums, exhibitions and other activities provided great platforms for the participants to share their experiences and achievements in higher education, vocational education and basic education. The topics covered teacher-student exchange, talent training,

collaboration in running schools, joint research, cooperation between think tanks, etc. Third, the China-ASEAN TVET Consortium was founded, aiming to build a new bilateral and multilateral vocational education cooperation platform and promote mutual learning and exchanges between countries. The ultimate goal is to enable more students, teachers, schools and companies to benefit from cooperation and to build a closer China-ASEAN community for vocational education. Fourth, the "Zhi & Xing Guizhou" Silk Road Youth Exchange Programme was carried out, and the ASEAN-China Smart Education Institute in Colorful Guizhou was launched. These were part of the substantive results of the cooperation week.

## Guiyang, Palmerston North celebrate 30th anniversary of sister city partnership

On August 17, Guiyang and Palmerston North celebrated the 30th anniversary of the establishment of their sister city relationship via video link. Ma Ningyu, Mayor of Guiyang, and his counterpart Grant Smith delivered speeches. Yan Dong, Vice President of the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries (CPAFFC), Wang Xiaolong, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the People's Republic of China to New Zealand, Clare Fearnley, New Zealand's Ambassador to China, and Zhang Hanlin, Director-General of the Foreign Affairs Office of Guizhou Province also gave remarks. Lin Ping, Vice Mayor of Guiyang, presided over the meeting.

At the meeting, the two cities signed an agreement reaffirming their sister city partnership, and gave each other souvenirs for the 30th anniversary. The representative of the first Māori people who settled down in Palmerston North delivered opening and concluding remarks, and ethnic groups from the two cities presented their distinctive song-and-dance performances.

Going forward, the two sides will further their cooperation in various areas such as trade, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, culture, tourism, sustainability and
