King Glory Plaza 金光华广场

King Glory Plaza, Shenzhen has set new standards for international shopping centers in China with its stunning architectural design, sheer size and an amazing variety of shops, entertainment and leisure facilities. It is large, with seven levels above ground and three levels underground. It's also connected to the Friendship Mall by a Shenzhen and Hong Kong through telescopes. Cars and people on the streets flow like a stream. The Shenzhen River looks like a green ribbon connecting Shenzhen with Hong Kong. The appealing panoramic cityscape of Hong Kong can be clearly seen.

Shenzhen Litchi Park

深圳市南山区荔枝公园



Litchi Park, which is famous for its litchi trees, bushes, lawns and peaceful environment, is regarded as a "green pearl" in downtown Shenzhen. As litchis ripen in the early summer, the park is garnished with green leaves and colorful fruit which look like red clouds. The

litchi are so fresh that they make people's mouths water. White plum trees stand quietly in the park. Deep-rooted rubber plants rise from the ground with their long tree beards dropping down the ground. King palms sway in the breezes. There is a small stone path that wanders for more than 200 meters, beside which grow thousands of bamboo plants. Weeping willows beside the lake are like graceful southern damsels. With its green scenery, Litchi Park is full of vitality and life.

Shenzhen Zhongshan Park

深圳中山公园

Zhongshan Park is located in the western area of Shenzhen Special Economic Zone

(SEZ), which is the only park in Shenzhen named after Dr Sun Yat-sen, the father of the revolution that ended imperial rule in China. Built in 1925, it covers about 490,000 square meters and is the city's oldest park. The forest, which was planted more than 70 years ago, is thriving. There is also a part of the old city rampart from the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644), with a length of 646 meters, a height of 6 meters and a width of 3 meters. It's a gray stone structure built on a red sandstone foundation. The wall was constructed as early as 1394, the 27th year of the reign of the first Ming Emperor Hong Wu. In October 1983, Zhongshan Park was declared among the city's first batch of key cultural relics protection units.
