# Shenzhen Golf Club 深圳高尔夫俱乐部

Shenzhen Golf Club is located near the midway point of the Shennan Road, an eight-minute drive from Huanggang Port. It's the nearest mainland golf club to Hong Kong and is opposite the famous Honey Lake Country Club. The acclaimed Japanese golfer Isoa Aoki designed the first 18 holes, and the latter nine holes were co-designed by professional golfers from Hong Kong. In 1997, the club's board funded the rebuilding of the 27-hole course, which was redesigned by Neil Haworth, who added additional waves, sand, water bunkers and trees. The grass was also changed, and a new computer-controlled irrigation and drainage system was installed. The result is a fresh, new course. Address: Shennan Road, Futian district, Shenzhen

# Shenzhen Sand River Golf Club 深圳沙河高尔夫球会

Shenzhen Sand River Golf Club, nestled alongside Shenzhen Bay, offers a 27-hole course and an additional nine-hole course lit up for night golfing. It is home to the Gary Player Golf Training Academy, one of the biggest training academies in the world, providing first-rate instruction and a driving range. The club also neighbors the Shenzhen Window of the World theme park and is a 15-minute drive from the Hong Kong border. ### Shenzhen Tycoon Golf Club

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# **ATTRACTIONS**

## **Shenzhen Yantian Seafood Street** 盐田海鲜街



Shenzhen is a seaside city situated along the southern coast of China. The seafront not only provides the natural port and clean beach but also various seafood made into thousands of dishes. Located in Yantian port in eastern Shenzhen, Yantian Seafood Street is one of the most seafood spots in South China. Locals here still fish in the sea like their ancestors, so the marks of abandoned docks and old bridges are still traceable. They hail back to the image of a small fishing village, like Shenzhen was just 20 years ago.

t Now there are metropolitan characters everywhere on this street, while customers and visitors from all over China gather every day to enjoy the sea-view and the delicious seafood.

LIFE IN SHENZHEN

There are dozens of restaurants on Yantian Seafood Street. Most of them are three-floor buildings along the coast with sea-view terraces on top floors. In addition to restaurants, there are also seafood wholesale markets. The seafood street mainly offers Hakka and Chaozhou flavors, and the onsite catch-and-sell fare is served with fermented soybean oil after it's steamed.

## Shiyan Lake Hot Spring Holiday Resort 石岩湖温泉度假村

Covering a total area of 3.9 square kilometers, Shiyan Lake Hot Spring Holiday Resort is famous for its pure, natural hot springs. It has a history of 1,000 years. The buildings are of Spanish-style and dotted with modern sculptures. It has luxurious sauna room and 400 odd rooms. Restaurants offer Chinese and Western dishes. There is a romantic coffee bar, a nightclub, karaoke spots and stores. The resort also has a horseracing track, a swimming pool, billiards, bumper cars, games, a fishing club, the Taigong fishing



pool, and fireworks and barbecue sites. *Address:* 40km from downtown Shenzhen

#### Dapeng Ancient City 大鹏古城

eng Fortress, Qing Dynasty Hakka architecture, Song Dynasty Young Emperor's Tomb and the Goddess Temple.

Built in 1394, Dapeng Ancient City is in Pengcheng village, Dapeng town, in the eastern part of Shenzhen. It covers a total



area of 110,000 square meters. The name of the city originated from the establishment of Dapeng Defensive City for the General to fight against Japanese pirates in the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644). It is also the reason Shenzhen is also known as "Peng City". The magnificent South, East and West gates and residential buildings of the Ming and Qing (1644-1911) dynasties are well preserved. The zigzag ging lanes are laid with stones. The buildings are of a style reserved for generals. The residence of Lai Enjue, who was called General Zhenwei and is famous for fighting against British invaders, is the grandest. It's 150 years old. It contains dozens of houses, halls, wells, corridors

and yards. The plates and detailed decorations of the buildings make the city more attractive. Visitors can also find Marquis Temple, Goddess Temple, Temple of Marshal Zhao and General's Office here. *Address: Dapeng Peninsula, Longang district* 

# Xin'an Ancient City 新安故城

Also known as Nantou Ancient City, Xin'an Ancient City covers an area of 70,000 square meters and it is located north of Tianqiao in Nanshan district. The ancient city has a history of more than 1,730 years. It was first established in the first year (1573 AD) of Emperor Wanli in the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644). It was at the junction of rivers and sea transportation routes, and was a strategic post along the coast. During the Opium War in 1840, Hong Kong was ceded to Britain, and Xin'an people fought bravely against the British invaders. The first phase of renovation work has been completed. More than 10 sites are restored. These are the Archway of Xin'an Ancient City, the South Gate, the County Yamen (Government Office in Feudal China), Xin'an Prison, the Coastal Defense Office, the Office of Dongguan Guild Hall, Guandi Temple, Temple of Wen Tianxiang, the Opium Houses, the Jieguan Hall, the Juxiu Building, Yili Pawnshop and Taomigong Qianzhuang (an old-style Chinese private bank).

Shenzhen is not only a modern city reform, but also a city of ancient civilization. New Stone-Age ruins found in Xiantouling in Dapeng indicate humans inhabited

the area at least 6,700 years ago. There are more than 40 protected sites containing cultural relics around Shenzhen, including the well-known Zhongying Street, Dap-
