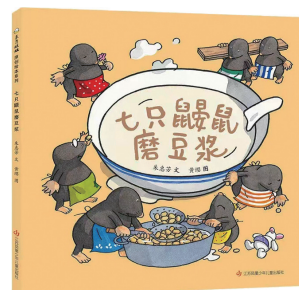


Seven Moles Milling Soybean

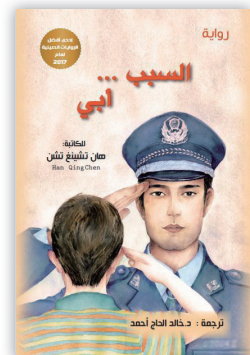
Because of the Father
