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Forewords

Message from the Secretariat

Time flies. It is a great pleasure to reflect the work of South and Southeast Asian University Network (S&SE Asian UN) in 2024 with all member universities.

This year, Yunnan University, as the Secretariat of the S&SE Asian UN, has adhered to its original aspiration of fostering cultural exchange and mutual understanding between China and South and Southeast Asia. We have strived to build the S&SE Asian UN into a platform for South and Southeast Asian regional higher education exchange and collaboration, making significant efforts to promote academic exchanges, interpersonal interactions, and talent cultivation.

In terms of academic exchange, we organized seminars, international academic forums, and summer schools across multiple disciplines to enhance collaboration and exchange in teaching and research. We arranged internships for students at member universities to broaden their international perspectives, completed the second phase of the Chair Professorship Program to strengthen inter-university cooperation, and hosted international youth exchange activities to enhance cultural understanding and recognition.

In talent cultivation, we partnered with several high-level member universities to innovate and launch joint international education programs, achieving progress in new academic programs and co-built laboratories. We introduced courses on global governance to support cultivating high-quality future talent. We also encouraged students to participate in international competitions and overseas study programs, providing comprehensive opportunities to expand their global outlook.

Moreover, we actively expanded the scope of cooperation with our partner alliances. From attending activities to co-hosting events, from online communications to in-person exchanges, we facilitated study, internship, and employment opportunities for multiple students at partner institutions and alliances. These efforts have strengthened the ties with our close partners, paving the way for more dynamic future development.

It is worth mentioning that this year, we were delighted to welcome five new member universities and four new university ambassadors, further expanding the S&SE Asian UN's scale and influence.

Looking back, the S&SE Asian UN's progress is inseparable from the support of our member universities. Looking ahead, we remain committed to advancing the establishment of a regional higher education community. We welcome more universities to join us, forge new partnerships, explore more collaborative opportunities, and work together to foster mutual understanding between China and South and Southeast Asia.

The 2024 Kunming Forum on Education Cooperation in South & Southeast Asian



The 2024 Kunming Forum on Education Cooperation in South & Southeast Asian

The 2024 Kunming Forum was held by Yunnan University (YNU) on Oct 25, 2024. A total of 160 representatives, including experts, scholars, consulate representatives, students and business delegates from China and 14 South and Southeast Asian countries attended.

During the opening ceremony, the inauguration of the Sub-committee of Sustainable Mountain Development of the S&SE Asian UN, as well as the Initiation Ceremony of New Members was held.

At four academic sub-forums, experts and scholars exchanged insights on topics including rural revitalization and sustainable development, the Lancang-Mekong Cooperation Innovation Corridor development, biodiversity conservation and characteristic resource utilization, and international Chinese language education cooperation.

The forum was co-organized by Institute of International Rivers and Eco-Security of YNU and the S&SE Asian UN. More than 20 experts and scholars from seven Hindu Kush-Himalayan (HKH) countries, including China, India, Nepal, and Bangladesh, participated. Attendees represented 12 universities and research institutions, such as the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD), YNU, COMSATS University Islamabad, Fareast International University, and Tribhuvan University.

The forum featured a round-table discussion moderated by TRUONG Huyen Chi, Secretary-lead of the Himalayan University Consortium. Experts shared experiences in sustainable mountain development, discussing water resources, environmental issues, and community involvement in their respective countries. The discussions highlighted technological innovation, policy support, ecological protection, and cultural heritage, with particular attention to successful practices in addressing climate change, ecological conservation, and rural revitalization.

Seminar on the Lancang-Mekong Cooperation Innovation Corridor Development

On Oct 25, the seminar was organized by the School of Economics at YNU and the Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) Knowledge Network and supported by the Yunnan Academy of Science and Technology, the Mekong Institute, and the Yunnan Society for Science and Technology Information.

Over 40 experts and scholars from institutions and universities in Laos, Malaysia, Thailand, Pakistan, and China attended the event. Participants shared insights on innovation cooperation in renewable energy, low-carbon resource transitions, the digital economy, and geographical indicator industries in the Lancang-Mekong region. The seminar provided a valuable platform for Chinese and international experts to exchange perspectives on the future directions of innovation and development in the Lancang-Mekong region.

The event advanced industry, education, research and application and supported sustainable industry development and harmonious coexistence between people and nature.

This symposium, organized by the School of International Chinese Language Education at YNU, welcomed over 140 participants. These included representatives from administrative departments for international exchange and cooperation and schools of international Chinese education. Themed “Cultural Exchange, Cooperative Innovation, and Advancement of a Chinese Education Cooperation Mechanism in South and Southeast Asia”, the symposium also featured a Teacher Forum and a Graduate Forum.

The event marked significant progress in establishing the Yunnan Province International Chinese Language Education Research Association. It laid a strong foundation for strengthening discipline-building in international Chinese education and promoting exchange and cooperation in Chinese language education across South and Southeast Asia.

Center for China Studies at University of Dhaka

The Center for China Studies was inaugurated on March 24 at University of Dhaka (DU) in Bangladesh. This center represents the latest achievements in educational, academic, and cultural exchange collaboration between China and Bangladesh, and highlights the deepening friendship between the two countries. Through this center, YNU and DU will engage in academic research, personnel exchanges, and project collaborations.

Seminar on Myanmar-China Cultural Exchange

The forum was held from Oct 12 to 13 in Mandalay, Myanmar. It was jointly organized by Yunnan University and Yadanabon University, with support from the Institute of International Relations and the Institute of Myanmar Studies at YNU, as well as the Confucius Classroom at Fuqing Language and Computer School. The event brought together 22 scholars from Yadanabon University, Mandalay University, Mandalay University of Foreign Languages, Mandalay University of Distance Education, Institute of International Relations, Institute of Myanmar Studies, School of Ethnology and Sociology at YNU, Shenzhen University, and Sun Yat-sen University.

This forum marked the resumption of in-person academic exchanges between Chinese and Myanmar universities since 2022, drawing significant attention and anticipation from various sectors of the local community.

The 12th ACAS International Conference on Asian Studies

On November 14-15, 2024, the 12th ACAS International Conference on Asian Studies, co-hosted by Ateneo de Manila University, Sub-committee of Journalism and Communication, School of Journalism (College of Internalization Communication of South and Southeast Asia) of YNU, was successfully held in Quezon City, the Philippines.

The academic partners of the conference also include the Muhammadiyah University of Yogyakarta, Central Philippine University, Polytechnic University of the Philippines, Far Eastern University, Universiti Malaysia Sabah and the Philippine Association of Asian Studies. The conference has also received strong support from the Confucius Institute at Ateneo de Manila University, the Southeast Asian Studies Program at Ateneo, and the Ricardo Leung China Research Center.

The conference, themed "Artificial Intelligence in Asian Societies: Opportunities, Challenges, and Social Dynamics," was held in a hybrid format with four parallel sessions. Over 200 experts, scholars, and representatives from China, the Philippines, Indonesia, Malaysia, and South Korea participated in the conference. Over 60 scholars shared their papers and research findings. Among them, teachers and students from YNU participated in the conference as one of the co-sponsors and presented their researches.

The 3rd Graduate Summer School on Frontiers of International Communication Theory and Research Methods

The 3rd Graduate Summer School on Frontiers of International Communication Theory and Research Methods Facing South and Southeast Asia was successfully held from August 10 to 18, 2024.

This summer school was organized by the School of Journalism (School of International Communication for South and Southeast Asia) at YNU , the School of Journalism and Communication at Communication University of China, the Sub-committee of Journalism and Communication of the S&SE Asian UN, and the Halliday Centre for Intelligent Applications of Language Studies at City University of Hong Kong. Nearly 60 teachers and scholars from 40 universities participated.

During the summer school, 38 well-known experts and scholars domestically and internationally gave lectures. They engaged in discussions on cutting-edge theories and practical issues in international communication. The program provided participants with valuable knowledge and experience through diverse teaching methods, deepening the young scholars' understanding of international communication theory and practice. It also contributes to advancing China's international communication capabilities, offering more wisdom and strength to promote exchanges and mutual learning among world civilizations.

China-Thailand International Joint Ecological Field Research

From Feb 19 to March 2, a team of 15 faculty members and students from School of Ecology and Environmental Sciences at YNU participated in the 13-day China-Thailand International Joint Field Research with Faculty of Forestry at Kasetsart University in Thailand.

The field research comprised lectures and fieldwork. During the indoor sessions, six professors from Faculty of Forestry delivered lectures on forest biodiversity in Thailand, watershed management, and forest restoration. The team then conducted field studies at research stations and large forest plots, deepening their understanding of the structure and biodiversity of Thailand's tropical forests. They also explored the application of ecological knowledge in biodiversity conservation, mangrove restoration, and water management.

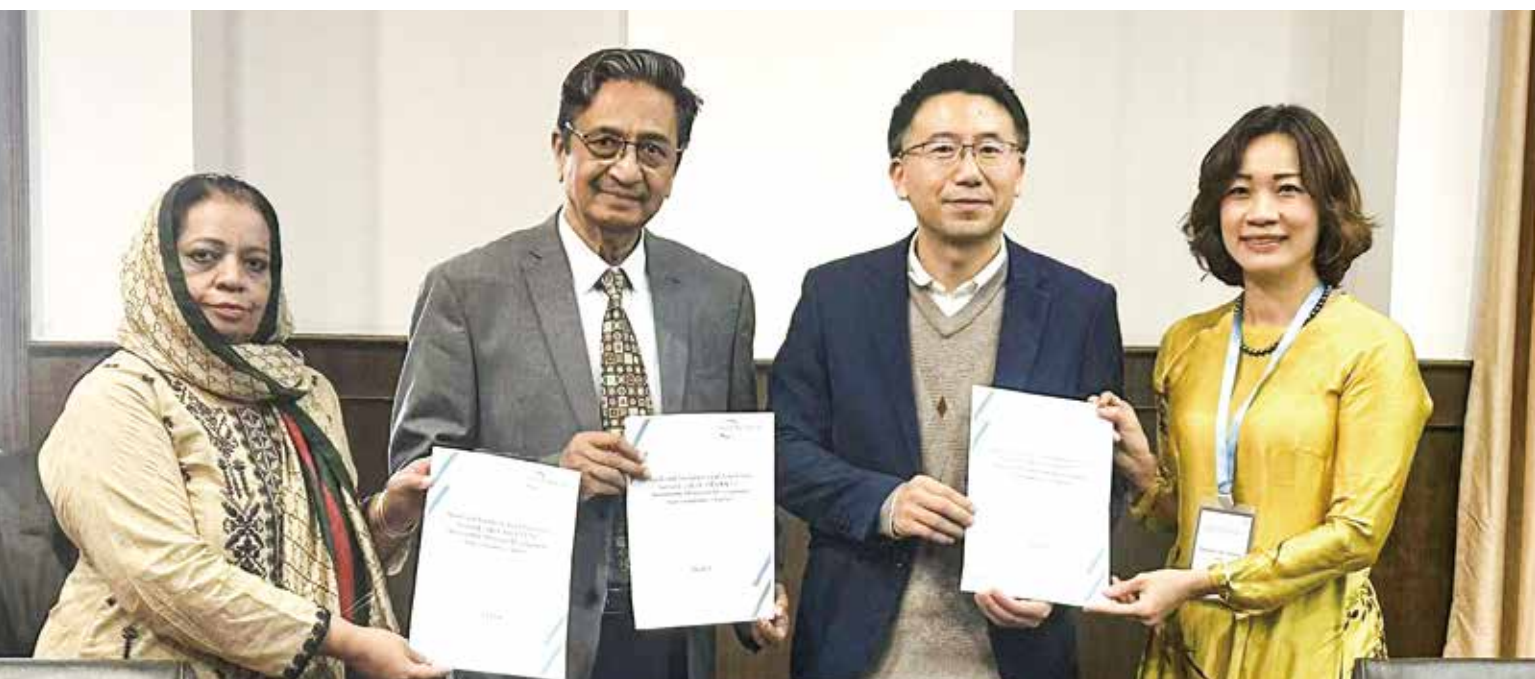
S&SE ASIAN UN FOCUS

South and Southeast Asian University Network

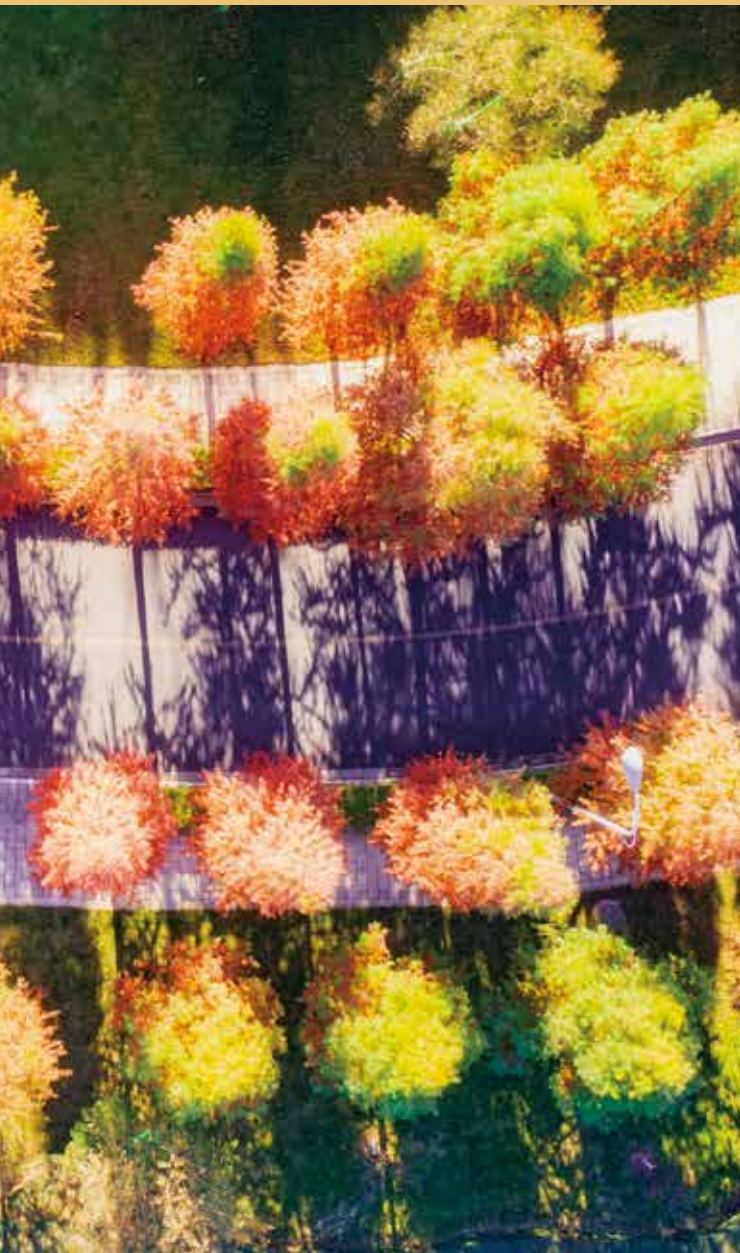
The South and Southeast Asian University Network, also known as S&SE Asian UN, is a higher education regional international cooperation mechanism approved by the Yunnan Provincial Department of Education and filed in the International Division of the Ministry of Education, and initiated by Yunnan University (YNU) in Kunming, Yunnan Province in December 2018. The Secretariat of S&SE Asian UN is permanently located at YNU.

It aims to further enhance the people-to-people bonds between China and South Asian and Southeast Asian countries, establish a platform for regional higher education exchanges and cooperation, as well as build a regional higher education community.

To date, there are 123 member universities from 16 countries, including Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Cambodia, India, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Vietnam and China.

After six years of development, S&SE Asian UN have become an important platform for cultural exchanges in South Asia and Southeast Asia.





At present, S&SE Asian UN have created several major brand activities, including the South and Southeast Asian University Presidents' Forum, International Academic Forums of S&SE Asian UN, Kunming Forum supported by the Yunnan Provincial Department of Education, and the S&SE ASIAN UN Chair-professorship Program.

Since 2021, S&SE Asian UN have established five sub-committees, Sub-committee of Emerging Engineering Education, Sub-committee of Innovation and Entrepreneurship Education, Sub-committee of Journalism and Communication, Sub-committee of Chinese Language Education, and Sub-committee of Sustainable Mountain Development.

In the future, S&SE Asian UN will implement the Four-Year Development Plan for the South and Southeast Asia University Network (2024-2027), as well as further promote the people-to-people bond and policy communication between China and South Asian and Southeast Asian countries, enhancing Belt and Road cooperation.

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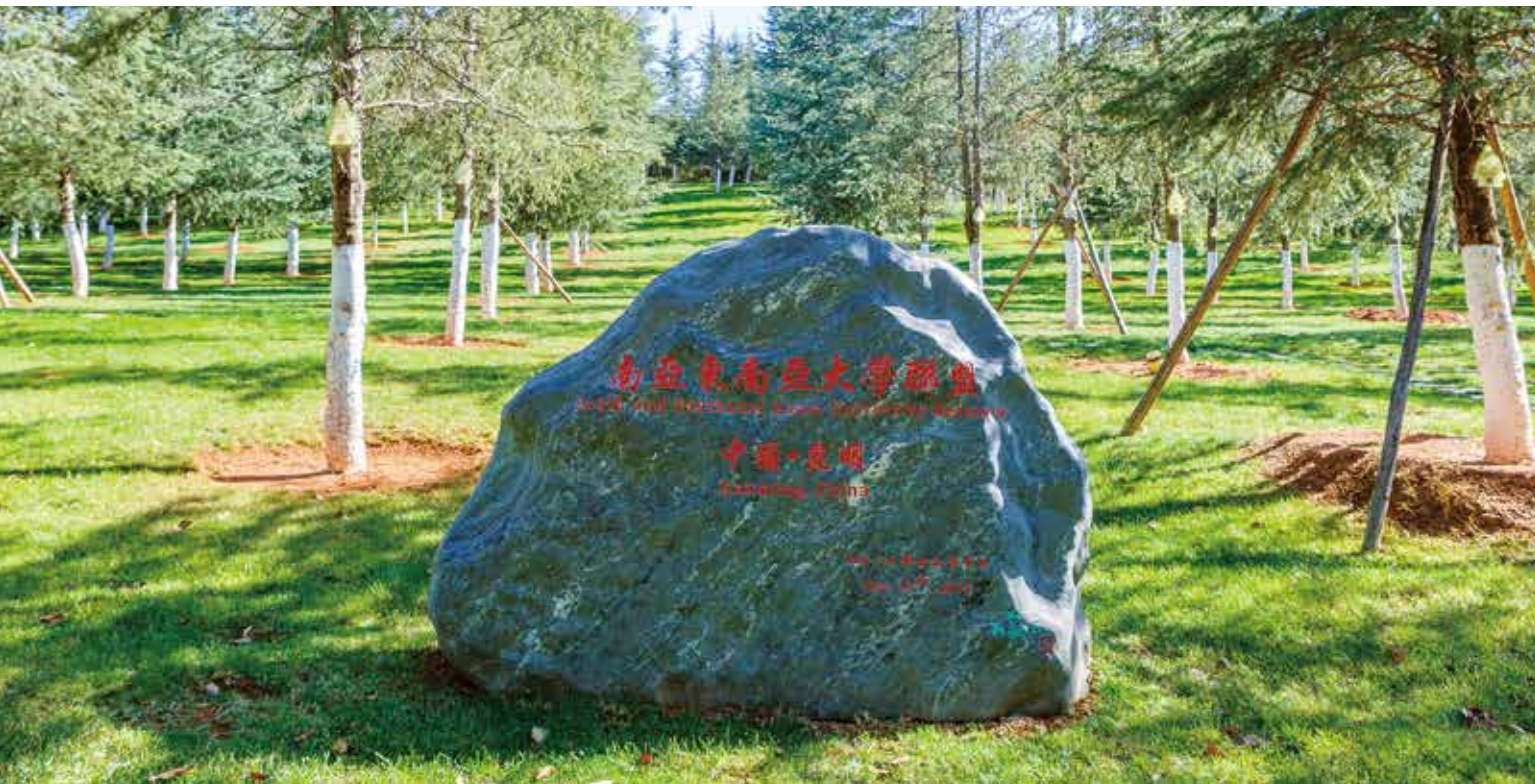
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
